# FORMAL PRAYER AND REFLECTION

The school provides opportunities for prayer and reflection in formal and informal ways.

The purpose of formal prayer and reflection is to introduce the school community to different experiences of prayer and liturgy. Daily 'Sacred Space' takes place for all students and is an opportunity to gather, reflect and pray. Our school Prayer is said daily in Formation Time, alongside the focus for that day and the additional prayerful opportunity.

Prayer and worship can take place in a number of spaces; the main hall, our prayer garden, our chapel, in formation rooms, The Oratory, classrooms or smaller intervention spaces and the local parish church.

These events are led by the school chaplain with the support of our parish priest, the Mission team, the senior leadership team, Year teams and members of the wider staff. The styles and types of prayer and liturgy offered ensures a wide range of engaging and creative experiences of the breadth and richness of the Catholic tradition.

Where and when Formal Prayer and Reflection takes place;

- Staff gathering every Tuesday morning
- Year 7 Mass of Welcome
- Student drop in the Chapel each breaktime
- Staff prayers 'Prayer & Pastries' is every Friday in the Chapel.
- Liturgies for important occasions, e.g. Ash Wednesday, Holy Week, Advent, our Feast day
- Sacramental opportunities each term including Reconciliation during Lent
- Staff and Governor meetings in school begin with a prayer
- Students take part in Chapel visits and prayerful experiences
- Prayers and reflections are shared on the school website and social media to encourage families to pray at home





### **COLLECTIVE WORSHIP**

# Formation Time - Prayer and liturgy;

- Each week there is a Collective Worship theme in line with the Liturgical year, this is shared through the published school calendar
- Each tutor group should participate in a daily act of Collective Worship/ Prayer & Liturgy
- Form tutors are guided through the shared area, where they have the resources for Sacred Space each day
- Formal prayers e.g. The 'Our Father' and 'Hail Mary' are included in the weekly Prayer and Liturgy (Sacred Space)

The school prayer is displayed in every classroom and is said each day in Formation time

- Tutors have a duty encourage students to plan and deliver collective worship, within the form group
- During prayer, tutors ensure that a purposeful and focused atmosphere is created and that students respect one another.
- Saints Peter and Paul support the Archdiocese in preparing students for the Sacrament of Confirmation. We work closely with the local parishes to promote the importance of the Sacrament. The theology is covered in RE lessons currently within the Year 8 curriculum.

# **Catholic Social Teaching**

Our School Year is divided into focus themes, linked directly to Catholic Social Teaching. This gives purpose and direction to each term – the focus for our whole school community. It is the termly thread that runs through lessons, Formation time and our Pastoral programme

# Professional development for staff

- Collective Worship delivery and resources are provided as part of the induction process for new staff
- INSET for the Catholic life of the school, Catholic Social Teaching and the delivery of Collective Worship are part of an ongoing cycle for all staff and leaders
- Resources are provided for Collective Worship (Sacred Space) and are Quality Assured within the school monitoring and evaluation cycles
- The Chaplain, Mission Team and SLT model good practice as leaders of and participants in prayer and liturgy.

# **Parish life**

We are proud of our strong links with our local parish, meeting regularly with Fr Peter and welcoming him into our school community. Our students participate in local events and contribute to our wider Parish.

# MONITORING AND EVALUATION OF COLLECTIVE WORSHIP

- Collective Worship is monitored through a cycle of learning walks and drop-ins (informally and formally using the Formation Time remit) by SLT, Progress Leaders, the Mission team and the School Chaplain and is part of the school's cycles of QA.
- Pupil Voice and Staff Voice surveys are conducted on a regular intervals to provide indications for further improvement.
- Refreshers on Collective Worship for staff are offered throughout the year
- Collective Worship delivery and resources are provided as part of the induction process for new staff.
