Here is our handy guide to services available in your area. By choosing the right service you can help your little one feel better, quicker.

Coughs and colds

Upset tummy

Minor cuts, bumps and bruises

Minor stings and bites

#### When to go to a doctor

If you are worried about your child's health, then you should speak to your GP first.

Out of hours, you can call 111 who will help to decide whether your child needs to be seen right away or if the issue can wait to be treated the next day by your own family doctor.

Common illnesses that can be treated by your GP are;

- Persistent coughs Eye infections
- Skin infections
- Ear pain

#### When to go to urgent treatment / walk-in centres

If your GP surgery is closed, or your child's condition is more urgent, but not life-threatening, then your local Urgent Treatment / Walk-in Centre has specialist nurses and doctors that can help.

Many local centres have x ray equipment too, which means you don't always need to attend A&E. Common conditions that can be treated here include:

- Minor burns
- Minor breathing difficulties (asthma / croup / bronchiolitis) Suspected fractures
- Uncontrolled feve

#### When to go to A&E

Accident and Emergency is for people with life-threatening illness or injury, so if you think your child needs immediate attention, then you should attend A&E. Conditions that require immediate attention include;

• Shortness of breath or working hard to breather resulting in drawing in of the chest when breathing or making a grunting poice.

- breathing or making a grunting noise

- Severe breeding of sources
  Head or eye injuries
  Allergic reactions causing swelling of the face,
  lips, eyes or tongue, fainting or trouble breathing
  Serious animal bites

  (and under 2 months of age with a fever
- Infants under 2 months of age with a fever Blue or purple lips, skin or fingernails
- Uncontrolled pain



If your child is struggling to breathe or loses consciousness, you should call 999

### **SAFEGUARDING**

ATTENDANCE MATTERS!



Good attendance is so important in helping to keep your child safe and building their resilience, not only in lessons, but for life after school. When they aren't in school, we can't look after them and they can't learn.

As a school we set high expectations for attendance, but since the Covid pandemic, many students have found getting back into the routine of school difficult. Here's what we are doing as a school to help:

- Reinforcing the importance of attendance in daily conversations throughout school
- Celebrating students who attend every lesson all week
- Recognising students who maintain or improve their attendance record
- Strictly monitoring the use of toilets during lesson time

When home and school work together, we can get the best results for all our students, and we'd like to thank all parents who support us in helping your child to meet their attendance targets.

If your child is struggling with attendance at the moment, we'll get in touch with you as soon as possible with advice and support in making positive improvements for the rest of the term.

## HAVE YOU GOT A 'PLAN B'?

Getting to and from school can be one of the biggest challenges for our Year 7 students as they navigate high school.

Coming up with a 'Plan B' with your child is a great way to help them prepare for when their usual method of transport is unavailable.

- If they miss the bus, do they know an alternative bus they can take?
- Their regular lift hasn't turned up! Is getting a taxi an option?
- Running late after school. Which number can they call to arrange for someone to collect them?

Please remind your child that if they have no way of getting home safely, they should always approach reception and we will always help them!

# HIGH EXPECTATIONS **FOR HOME STUDY**


When we show our pupils that we know they can be high achievers, we help them surpass their own expectations of themselves.

Home study plays an extremely important role in your child's learning.

And as a school, we need to set them up for success to help them go further through work they complete at home.

## **All About Home Study - FAQs**



At P&P, we focus on quality not quantity when it comes to home study. When we build home study, into lesson, students can see the immediate benefit too.

### How do teachers plan home study tasks?

Where possible, we try to work together to ensure your child isn't overwhelmed by their home study workload and that tasks set complement each other.

### Does my child have enough time to do their home study?

We aim to upload home study onto EduLink for a 3pm start on a Monday afternoon and set an 8:00am hand-in deadline later in the week. This should give your child adequate time to complete their homework, but if they're struggling they should speak to their subject teacher.

### What support does my child receive to complete their home study?

In school, we show students how to complete home study and are clear about what our expectations are in terms of deadlines and submission requirements. It's really important that school and home work together to support your child, and we'll keep you up to date with your child's home study progress.
